# Chocolate Chip Cookie

## Materials:

small amounts of worsted weight yarn: $\tan$ (MC) and dark brown (CC)
$5^{\prime \prime}$ double pointed needles (dpn), US $8(5 \mathrm{~mm})$ tapestry needle

Gauge:
Though gauge is not critical for this project, it is still important. You do not want to end up with giant cookie. Work through rnd 10 and the piece


They look good enough to eat! should be approximately $3^{\prime \prime}$ in diameter.

Finished size: approximately $3^{\prime \prime}$ in diameter
Notes:
Lifted increase: Knit the purl bump of the stitch below the next stitch, then knit the stitch.
Directions:
With MC, cast on 4 sts and join being careful not to twist the stitches..
Rnds 1, 3, 5, 7, 9: Knit.
Rnd 2: Using a lifted increase, increase in each stitch. (8 sts)
Rnd 4: Repeat rnd 2. (16 sts)
Rnd 6: *K1, increase in next stitch; rep from * around. (24 sts)
Rnd 8: *K2, increase in next stitch; rep from * around. (32 sts)
Rnd 10: *K3, increase in next stitch; rep from * around. (40 sts)
Rnds 11, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20: K.
Rnd 13: *K3, K2tog; rep from * around. (32 sts)
With CC, make chocolate chips on top and on edge. Do not make any on the bottom.

Rnd 15: *K2, K2tog; rep from * around. (24 sts)
Rnd 17: *K1, K2tog; rep from * around. (16 sts)
Rnd 19: *K2tog; rep from * around. (8 sts)
Cut yarn leaving a 10 " tail. Using the tapestry needle, pull tail through the 8 remaining sts and pull it snug. Pull through the first 3
 or 4 sts again. Insert needle in other side of the cookie, catching a bit of yarn. (This helps the cookie lie flat. You can use matching thread and sew a couple of stitches on each side of the cookie instead). Bury the tail inside the cookie.
